Introduction – WE ARE HOUSERS!

- Provides affordable housing opportunities through owning, operating, and developing housing in Montgomery County
- Administer federal, state, county, and private affordable housing programs
- Mission Provide affordable housing and supportive services that enhance the lives of low to moderate income households
- Our Customers Single Adults, Families w/Children, and Older Adults (62+)
- Greatest Challenge Meeting the housing need (units); Cost of managing existing units



Introduction – Housing Programs

- Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCV)
- -> Federal rent subsidy program
- -> Income Eligibility Limits (Ex. Family of 4 \$79,600)
- -> Rent payments are 30-40% of their adjusted income.
- -> HOC pays the landlord remaining portion of the rent.
- Project Based Rental Assistance Voucher Program (PBRA)
- Project Based Voucher (PBV)
- -> Federal rent subsidy program
- -> Same federal guidelines as HCV

Six (6) Properties Designated for Older Adults (62+) → 900 Units

33% or 2,459 Vouchers are utilized by Seniors

Introduction – Other Housing Programs

• Opportunity Housing – a non technical term used by HOC for its broad range of non-federally subsidized housing types owned by HOC. Includes the following:

-> Mixed Income Properties – market rate and affordable units in the same development (market rate rents subsidize the lower rents on affordable units)

-> Tax Credit Partnerships - Approx. 467 scattered site units funded through these partnerships

-> Scattered Sites – Approx. 1600 scattered site units (most often they are townhouses purchased through the MPDU program operated by the County)

-> Rent Supplement Program – County funded program in five (5) privately owned rental properties providing \$250 - \$350 per month of rental subsidy. Approx. 200 households served per year.



Overview – Housing Path Wait List

- In 2015, HOC launched Housing Path, an online wait list portal for affordable rental housing programs. Housing Path matches applicants to affordable housing programs based on household size, income, age, and other factors. To apply, go to <u>www.HOCHousingPath.com</u>.
- HOC selects applicants from the waitlist in order of the date/time application was submitted. Waitlist is always open for new applicants.

Introduction – Enrichment Programs

- HOC Academy Provides adult education, training, and employment/ workforce development opportunities; offers tuition assistance for adult learners; offers youth STEM enrichment
- Fatherhood Initiative Program Supporting families by supporting fathers and helping them to reach their fullest potential.
- Family Self Sufficiency Program (FSS) a 5-year voluntary program to assist families with goals towards economic self-sufficiency.
- Financial Literacy Coaching Offers one-on-one coaching, budget and credit counseling, and financial literacy workshops on various topics
- Youth Enrichment After School and Summer Programs & Adult Programs
